



Getting ready for A Level Geography

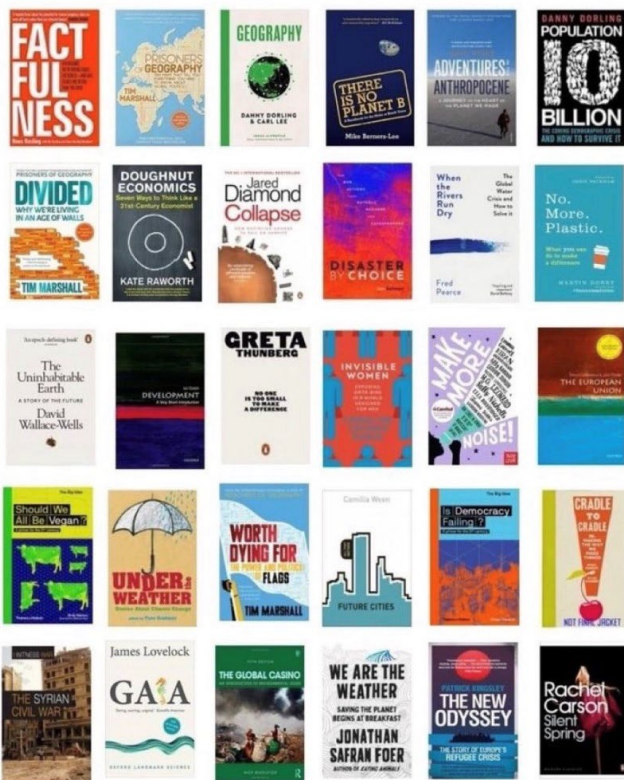
Welcome to **your** Geography A Level!

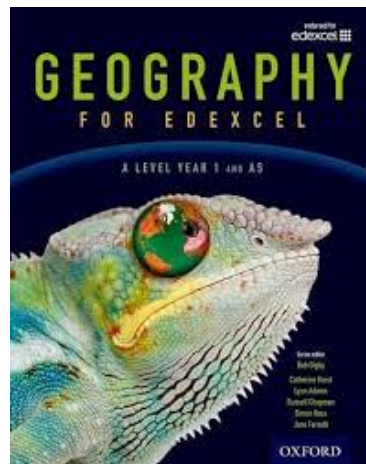

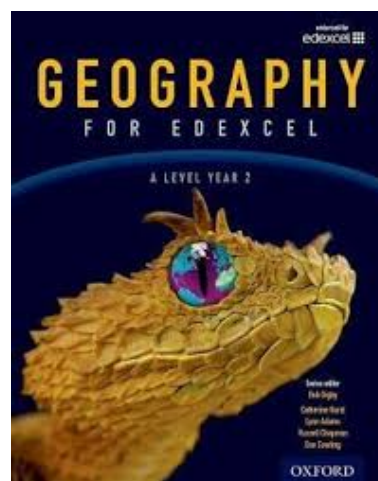
GEOGRAPHY RECOMMENDED READING
